Game Development Competition

The [WSPTA/Game Development Competition](#) is a STEM-based program, introduced in 2016, to encourage and support student success. Students in Grades 9-12 (or 7th and 8th Grade students as part of a larger group of 9th Graders or older) attending a school with a PTA in good standing may participate and share their knowledge of computer science based on an assigned theme. (See the FAQ for details on how 7th/8th Grade students may participate.)

The purpose of this competition is to provide an opportunity for students, either individually or in teams of up to six members, to use their creative talents and express themselves by developing a computer game. Students' submissions are judged in the following areas: game of the year, arts and animation, game design, programming (code), and audio design.

The theme for the 2019-2020 competition is: ANIMALS

Teams will register directly with WSPTA by completing an Intent to Submit form, due January 15, 2020. Students will upload their submission directly to the state level for judging. There is no fee for participation.

Transitional Kindergarten Program

Have you heard about the Everett School District "Transitional Kindergarten" program? The program accommodates children who are not currently in an early learning program and are scheduled to begin kindergarten in Autumn 2020. This program will focus on basic academic, social, and self-help skills to jumpstart qualifying students toward success in school. Students will be screened in early January and may qualify based on need.

"Transitional Kindergarten" classrooms will be located at several of the elementary schools in our district. Sites will be determined based on enrollment. The anticipated start date is January 28, 2020. "Transitional Kindergarten" will run through the last day of school, which is currently June 15, 2020.
